● 阅读理解

If you've ever emerged from the shower or returned from your walk with a clever idea or a solution to a problem you had been struggling with, it may not be a surprise. Rather than constantly concentrating on a problem, research from the last 15 years suggests that people may be more likely to have creative breakthroughs when they're doing a habitual task that doesn't require much thought.

"People always get surprised when they realize they get interesting, novel ideas at unexpected times," says Kalina Christoff, a scientist at the University of British Columbia in Vancouver. "Because our culture tells us that we should do it through hard work."

Now researchers begin to understand why these clever thoughts occur during more passive activities and what's happening in the brain. They have found that the key is a series of brain activities—within what's called the default mode (DM) network—that occur while an individual is resting or performing habitual tasks that don't require much attention.

"Simply put, it is a state that your brain returns to when you're relaxed," explains Christoff. "By contrast, when you're working on a demanding task, the brain's executive control (EC) systems keep your thinking focused, analytical, and logical."

Researchers find that the DM network is also involved in the early stages of idea generation, drawing ideas from past experiences and knowledge about the world. When your mind wanders, you're allowing thoughts to playfully cross your mind, which helps you combine information and ideas in new ways and something clicks.

"A cautionary note: while the DM network plays a key role in the creative process, it is the EC systems that help you to evaluate the creative ideas and apply them effectively to your problems in the real world," Christoff says. "So it's unwise to place blind faith in the discovery that creative ideas can be generated in the shower or during any other kinds of mind wandering. Instead, you have to do the work to set the groundwork for creative ideas to emerge in the first place."

Few without businesses can run giving kevboard computers. short cuts incredible importance. Schools view typing courses as necessary. But what are we giving up as handwriting loses its significance? Brain power, according to science. Researchers from Princeton University and the University of California conducted a series of studies to demonstrate the differences between students who wrote out their notes and those who typed them. Study participants took notes on a lecture using one of the two methods and were tested 30 minutes after the lecture, and again a week later.

The results showed both types of notetakers did well on the first test. The longhand notetakers had a stronger grasp of the overall concept. Students with the handwritten notes were also able to better remember and understand the concept of the lecture a week later, and were more open to understanding new ideas.

According to Pam Mueller, lead author of the study, "Our findings suggest even when laptops are used as intended, they may still be harming academic performance." Part of the reason is that it was faster to take notes on the laptop, using exactly the same words which meant they weren't truly engaged in the content. But notetakers using pen and paper tended to digest the material better and could rephrase it in their own words.

Although typing notes using exactly the same words can help in recalling facts in the short term, it takes the focus away from the main points of the lesson. "Ironically, the feature that makes their laptop notetaking so

attractive—the ability to take notes more quickly—was what weakened learning," educational psychologist Dr Kenneth Kiewra told the *Wall Street Journal*.

Computers aren't going away soon, but that doesn't mean paper notebooks become outdated. In fact, it is best to start using them at an early age. Researchers from the University of Indiana compared brain scans of five-year-olds—some who practised printing the letters, and some who just looked at the letters. Those who wrote out the letters had more enhanced and adult-like brain activity.

Levon Biss was looking at insects from his garden through a microscope he bought for his son. For fun, they unintentionally placed an insect under the lens (镜片). "It is amazingly beautiful!" they both screamed.

The father had been making a career taking photographs for advertisements. But that experience gave him a new direction. Around the world, insect populations are in decline because of habitat loss and climate change. Biss thought that if people could see what he saw through his son's microscope, they would care more about protecting insects.

So Biss turned to macrophotography: taking close-up pictures of small things, like flowers or bugs. His work has attracted attention not just for its unusual beauty. It also raises awareness of the need for conservation.

In 2016, Biss showed his first insect project, Microsculpture. The term refers to the features of an insect's exoskeleton, or outer shell, which develops over time as the bug adapts to its environment.

Biss' pictures capture the insects in all their microscopic details. Then he blows up the images until the insects become larger than life, some of them eight feet tall. But each image takes weeks to make. He uses a digital camera with a microscope lens. The camera is fixed on a computerized track, which allows Biss to take a shot, then move the camera by seven microns (微米)—a distance equals to about 1/10 the thickness of a human hair—for the next shot. In the end, Biss might take 10,000 shots of a bug. A computer combines these small pictures into a single image.

Biss' latest exhibition is Extinct and Endangered at the American Museum of Natural History. He selected bugs that were extinct or endangered, hoping his photographs would serve as a better purpose.
