cancer, one bar of soap at a time. He created a kind of cheap soap that could potentially help fight skin cancer. His invention won him the title of "America's Top Young Scientist" at the 3M Young Scientist Challenge, an annual competition that invites students in grades five through eight to "change their world for the better with a single innovative idea", on October 10, 2023.

At the age of 4, Heman moved to America from Ethiopia, where he always saw people constantly working under the hot sun. While he considered ideas for the competition, it struck him that so many people in his hometown were unaware of the risk of sun exposure. The recollections fueled his decision to focus his research on skin cancer.

"I hoped to make my idea something that not only was great in terms of science but also could be affordable for as many people as possible," Heman said. As he initially thought about his approach, Heman wanted his product to be something as much of a "constant" in people's life as possible, an item that was most convenient in contrast to other medicinal products.

In June 2023, he was selected as a top-ten finalist and paired with 3M product engineering specialist Deborah Isabelle to develop and test a physical prototype (原型) of his idea. It took the pair four months of trial and error to create "Skin Cancer Treating Soap" (SCTS). The bar contains chemicals that restore the body's dendritic cells killed by cancer cells. Once reconstructed, dendritic cells, the body's first line of defense against cancer and infections, are capable of fighting against cancer cells. SCTS, which costs just 50 cents a bar, still has to undergo clinical trials. The process could take over five years.

Heman's plan for the soap stretches far beyond the winning. He has a five-year plan, which includes seeking approval from the Food and Drug Administration. He also hopes to start a non-profit organization to distribute the soap in the future. "There is still a lot left to do," the 14-year-old teenager said.

Can you imagine getting a tooth pulled out or other major dental procedures without painkillers? A scientist colleague of mine used a "focus in" technique instead of requesting painkillers at the dentist's. Each time the dentist touched the tooth, my colleague felt bubbles of joy, and this lasted until the dentist interrupted by asking, "Why are you smiling?"

A fair question at this point is why anyone

would want to be fully aware of intense or painful procedures. But what may sound like a punishing choice—to directly face hurt or suffering—may in some instances be beneficial. A stream of scientific articles suggest that there are benefits in turning towards discomfort or emotions with negative acceptance. In addition, all of us can gain from finding ways to cope with stress and suffering-particularly when larger circumstances are beyond our control. As a researcher who has studied meditation (冥想) for more than 20 years, I believe that the development of calmness, a central element of certain mindfulness meditation practices, can help. I'm not advocating people putting themselves in dangerous or painful positions. But when we push ourselves into challenging or confusing situations, much like trainers who push athletes just past their comfort zone to make gains, learning often happens. Indeed, a 2022 study with more than 2,000 people participating demonstrated that those participants who were publicly encouraged to push themselves into awkward, uncomfortable situations—including taking classes to boost self-confidence and reading about opposing viewpoints-later reported the greatest degree of personal growth.

My own research indicates that meditation provides an ideal way to practise turning towards discomfort—particularly when it trains one's calm mind. People who reported higher levels of calmness reported less psychological distress (困扰).

Right now people are hurting for many reasons and looking for ways to cope with it. Without question, there are many important steps we need to take collectively to respond to these challenges. But we can each build our ability to recover on a personal level as well by cultivating greater acceptance of our experience—good or bad, painful or pleasant—in the present moment.
