She is widely seen as proof that good looks can last forever. But at over 500 years of age, time is catching up with Mona Lisa.

The health of the famous picture, painted by Leonardo da Vinci (莱昂纳多·达·芬奇) during 1503—1506, is **getting worse by the year, according to** the Louvre Museum (卢浮宫博物馆) where it is housed. "The thin, wooden panel (嵌板) on which Mona Lisa is painted in oils has lost its shape since experts checked it two years ago," the museum said. Visitors have noticed the change but repairing the world's most famous painting is not

him until his death, and it was eventually sold to France's King Francis I in 1519.

In 1911, the painting was stolen from the Louvre Museum by a former employee, who took it out of the museum hiding it under his coat. He said he had planned to return it to Italy. The painting was sent back to France two years later.

Grammer, whose hometown was just 15 miles from Paradise, was living with his family and working in the Los Angeles area when he saw accounts of the destruction on his friends' social media pages. A single mother he knew shared a photo of ash and rubble where her home once stood. A childhood friend's post showed her burned-down house. After he saw a photo of a friend Shane Edwards' home, which had been reduced to a brick wall with only a chimney standing, he was driven to paint it.

With Edwards' permission, Grammer then used spray paint to transform Edwards' burnt chimney into a strikingly black-and-white portrait of a woman, a piece he called Beauty Among the Ashes. Once the image was posted on Instagram, the victims of the fire, especially, could not contain themselves. "You bring beauty and hope," one posted. Over three months, the 47-year-old created a series of more than a dozen spray-painted murals on the remains of buildings and vehicles rendered useless by the flames. The images included a victim of the fire, a young girl who survived but lost her house, and a series of religious characters.

As a street artist, Grammer has committed his life to creating more art installations (艺术

装置) all over the world that connect people through tragic life events. He has started a foundation called the Art Through Hope Foundation where he intends to bring peace through his art to those affected by tragedy. Just by typing a few keywords and waiting a few seconds, a picture comparable to that painted by a human artist appears on screen.

AI art generators have seemingly swept the Chinese Internet. In some paintings created by AI, an elderly man can be shown as a young animated image, and pets can be turned into adorable cartoon girls or boys.

Huang Ge, an illustrator from Shanghai, said that it usually takes him several hours or days to complete one illustration. But with AI art generators, the efficiency is greatly improved. "Also, the generators have many modification (修改) modes, and the picture can be modified directly in the painting software," he added. Ding Jiao, a comic artist, considers the popularity of AI art generators reasonable as many people who are not good at drawing can create great works through them.

So is AI painting gradually replacing human painting? In the hot topic "Using a picture to prove that human artists will never be replaced by AI" online, many netizens uploaded their paintings to prove that humans are better than AI. "Though AI technology has developed rapidly, AI cannot fully replace humans. The warmth and inspiration in human creations are irreplaceable," said Ding Daoshi, an independent analyst.

Another controversial issue is that there is no consensus (共识) of who owns the copyright of AI art. Some users have openly sold their AI paintings and earned money, but it is still a grey area about whether these artworks belong to users, the digital tool developers or even AI.

Ding Daoshi noted that the various sides should get together to debate the issue and come up with some accepted rules as soon as possible because AI is already penetrating deeply into the lives of human beings.

[2024·江苏泰州中学高二阶段调研测试] Christ Mocked, by the Florentine master Cimabue, was sold at auction (拍卖) for €24 million in 2019. But the Chilean buyers never got to include the work in their collection because the French government refused to give it an export licence.

Ministers declared the painting a national treasure, officially giving the Louvre 30 months to raise the funds for its purchase. The Louvre recently reached an agreement with owners.

Laurence des Cars, the president of the Louvre, said it was a "great joy" to have acquired the painting, which "constitutes a crucial landmark in the history of art". The museum did not say how much it had paid, nor who had sold the painting, which will be exhibited in 2025.

The painting was spotted four years ago by Philomene Wolf, an auctioneer, when she was asked to assess the contents of a house that was being cleared. The owner, in her nineties, thought it was a painting from Russia of no value and was preparing to put it in the dustbin.

Wolf was struck by its quality and guessed that it could be Italian. Experts using modern technology confirmed that it was by Cimabue, who is widely regarded as having opened the gateway to Renaissance art. It is believed to date from 1280. Christ Mocked is one of about 15 known Cimabue's works.

The Louvre launched an appeal on Tuesday for donations to buy another painting, The

Basket of Wild Strawberries by Jean Simeon Chardin, the 18th-century French still life(静物 画) master. The work, which was first exhibited in 1761, was in a private collection from the 19th century until last year, when it was sold for €24.3 million to an American art museum at auction in Paris.

Luckily, many groups and individuals donated two-thirds of the sum. The museum must pay the remaining €8 million and is hoping that members of the public will help to ease the burden by responding to its appeal, which aims to raise $\in 1.3$ million.

Artists everywhere are getting "understandably nervous" about recent advances in artificial intelligence. Last month, a winner of an art prize at the Colorado State Fair "sparked a violent protest" when he posted the news and explained that he'd created his image using an AI program. Critics quickly accused 39-year-old Lance Allen of cheating. To be fair, Allen had won in the digital art category and made no secret of how the image had been produced. But the rules of art making are clearly changing.

"Allen's creative process, to be clear, was not a push-button operation," said Jason Blain in *Forbes*. He claims to have spent 80 hours on his entry, first fine-tuning his text prompts (提示), then touching up the final image using Photoshop and similar tools, then arranging to print the image on canvas. He made the finished product using AI much as a photographer creates an image using a camera.

But Allen, a tabletop game developer, is awed by AI's capabilities and urges artists and illustrators to welcome the technology rather than fight it. "Art is dead," he says. "AI won. Humans lost." A more inspiring lesson to take from his victory, though, is that image generators are likely to "expand the appreciation and creation of art" by opening the field to people, like him, who could never draw anything as detailed as his award-winning image. "If anything, we will have more artists, and as the technology progresses, we might see the emergence of art styles that none have seen before."

You can't blame traditional artists if they're unhappy. Image generators work their magic, after all, by analysing the aesthetics (美学) of millions of pre-existing images. One of the most complicated image generators "makes crystal clear just how destructive this technology will be," said Loz Eliot in New Atlas. Given a specific prompt, it can produce an image of just about anything you can imagine and even follow the style of a favourite artist's work. Its arrival marks "an incredible popularization of visual creativity" while aiming "a knife to the heart of anyone who's spent decades improving their artistic techniques hoping to make a living from them."

Her face is framed by wavy brown hair extensions, her filled lips pursed towards the viewer. It could be a description of an Instagram post, but the touched-up (修改过的) beauty is Diana Cecil, an English noblewoman who belongs to a powerful family at the Jacobean court. Experts at English Heritage have discovered that her portrait had been altered by restorers to enhance certain features, suggesting that our modern beauty standards might not be so modern after all.

The great-grand-daughter of William Cecil, Lord Burghley, one of Elizabeth I's closest advisers, Diana was considered one of the great beauties of her age. Yet it seems a later artist had other ideas. A restorer, probably in the 19th century, worked on the painting after it was damaged from being rolled sideways. It seems they also took the opportunity to alter the noblewoman's face, enlarging her lips and lowering her hairline to reduce the size of her forehead.

Now, following careful conservation work, Cecil's original appearance has been restored, with the full-length portrait-painted by Cornelius Johnson when Cecil was about 31. The conservation team discovered the changes made to the Johnson painting after removing a yellowing layer of oily liquid that had covered its original, more vivid colours. They also surprisedly found the artist's signature, and a date that had been signed in the portrait's curtain suggesting it was finished in 1634 and not 1638 as previously thought.

According Alice Tate-Harte, to conservator at English Heritage, it was not uncommon for people to "sweeten" old paintings in the 19th and early 20th centuries. "Conservation wasn't a profession, and they weren't working in institutions with salaries," she said. "They were artist restorers and they had a bit more flexibility to prettify and beautify, whereas we have a lot more ethics today. We must keep our retouching to a minimum. I hope I've done Diana justice by removing those additions and presenting her natural face to the world."
