She **is widely seen as** proof that good looks can last forever. But at nearly 500 years of age, time is catching up with *Mona Lisa*.

The health of the famous picture, painted by Leonardo da Vinci in the early 16th century, is getting worse by the year, according to the Louvre Museum (卢浮宫博物馆) where it is **housed**.

"The thin, wooden panel on which Mona Lisa is painted in oil has changed shape since experts checked it," the museum said. Visitors have noticed changes but repairing the world's most famous painting is not easy. Experts are not sure about the materials the Italian artist used and their current chemical state.

Nearly 6 million people go to see *Mona Lisa* every year, many attracted by the mystery of her smile. "It is very interesting that when you're not looking at her, she seems to be smiling, and then you look at her and she stops," said Professor Margaret Livingstone of Harvard University. "It's because direct vision (视觉) is excellent at picking up the detail, but less suited to looking at shadows. Da Vinci painted the smile in shadows."

However, the actual history of Mona Lisa is just as mysterious as the smile. Da Vinci himself

planned to return it to Italy. The painting was sent back to France two years later. After decades, the French hid the painting in small towns to keep it out of the hands of German forces.

It all started on the day I was binge-watching a talk show in which the host uttered these wise

words: "School in Shakespeare's day and age was vastly different from our own. In fact, it was far easier because students didn't have to study Shakespeare." I laughed when I heard this statement and then realized how rightful the claim is. I mean, most of us were not enthusiastic when we saw the name Shakespeare in a lesson or an assignment title, even for someone who enjoys reading, analysing pieces of literature, and writing.

It's pretty obvious that the manner in which the current school system handles art affects most students' understanding of it. When we are given a certain assignment based on, let's say, a play, many of us subconsciously connect our experience and opinion with that play based on how good or bad the process of completing that assignment was, especially if that was the first time we ever watched or read it. We stop appreciating the work in front of us and start choosing to notice only the elements necessary to help us complete that assignment. The beauty, joy, or even awe of reading and watching that play no longer exists.

Art is subjective. Each individual has a unique understanding of it. The features that make an artwork excellent are how well the piece succeeds in attracting us with its idea, how it affects us emotionally, and what we experience during our interaction with it. To have that free interaction removed will not only hurt the piece but also how students will engage with similar works in the future.

One of the fundamental solutions is to embrace the individuality that art brings—the liberty for a person to understand and interact with a piece through the lens of experiences lived, ideas absorbed, and emotions felt. Just like anyone, students are human beings.

By nature, classes and courses must have structure. Hence, it would be complicated if we leave total freedom to students. Therefore, we could have a theme, topic, or style for each lesson rather than assigning the same text to all of the students. Based on the theme or topic of the lesson, the students would freely choose a

piece of their liking to engage with. Doing so is not just another assignment but an extension of their interaction with an artwork.

Art is a reflection of the human experience. To quote from John Keating, played by the great Robin Williams: "We read and write poetry because we are members of the human race. And the human race is filled with passion." That is true for all forms of art. By changing the way that art is taught in schools, we can help students to see art as a valuable and enjoyable part of their lives. Ultimately, the goal of art education should be to help students develop a lifelong appreciation for art.

The question of whether it is possible to dissociate the artist from their work has been debated for a long time. Even though positive critical reviews about an artist's behaviour can improve their artistic accomplishments, people should treat artists as individuals who have lived apart from their work.

One of the reasons is that even artists have shortcomings. Like any other human being, an artist can err, and we cannot be severely judgemental of every person that falls into error. Cancel culture with endless criticism is concerned more with how we should disregard the artists when they make mistakes than with how their weaknesses can be used by the artists to create art that is unique.

Perhaps Kevin Hart's words support this thought. He asks, "When did we get to a point where life was supposed to be perfect? Where people were supposed to operate perfectly all the time?" When people start seeing artists as human beings, they'll see them for who they are and review their behaviour not on the basis of their art but on the basis of their humanity.

It should be also noted that there are works of art that are inspired by the artist's experience. For example, the themes in the *Harry Potter* books are so connected with J.K.Rowling's wicked worldview that it is virtually impossible to distinguish the two from each other. Since canceling artists based on their worldview would mean the reception to their art will suffer, artists become tense and unwilling to express themselves, which will kill creativity, eventually leading to the death of art. Comedians, singers or painters who should be integrating contemporary issues with their works become boring, and art stops functioning as the social mirror it ought to be.

An artist who makes mistakes still has art with intrinsic (内在的) value, benefiting entire communities or cultures. For instance, when Kendrick Lamar launched his album and frequently used the F-slur in one of his songs, there was much-heated discussion. He was entirely mistaken in using the F-slur, but as an artist, he still had a wide-reaching impact on society. Similarly, one can respect the late Michael Jackson because of how he impacted pop music and the inclusion of black musicians in mainstream media despite his

personal weaknesses, opinions, worldviews and associations.

While these artists may engage in their terrible behaviour, the art they produce today may serve as an example for others to produce outstanding work in the future. Some would refer to this process as a cycle. Good art should, therefore, be judged due to its value and not the value of the artist.

Mime (哑剧) opens up a new world to the beholder, but it does so insidiously (隐匿地), not by purposely injecting points of interest in the manner of a tour guide. Audiences are not unlike visitors to a foreign land who discover that the modes, manners, and thoughts of its inhabitants are not meaningless oddities, but are sensible in context.

I remember once when an audience seemed puzzled at what I was doing. At first, I tried to gain a more immediate response by using slight exaggerations. I soon realized that these actions had nothing to do with the audience's understanding of the character. What I had believed to be a failure of the audience to respond in the manner I expected was, in fact, only their concentration on what I was doing; they were enjoying a gradual awakening—a slow transition of their understanding from their own time and place to one that appeared so unexpectedly before their eyes. This was evidenced by their growing response to succeeding numbers.

Mime is an <u>elusive</u> art, as its expression is entirely dependent on the ability of the performer to imagine a character and to recreate that character for each performance. As a mime, I am a physical medium, the instrument upon which the figures of my imagination play their dance of life. The individuals in my audience also have responsibilities—they must be alert collaborators. They cannot sit back, mindlessly

self-content, and wait to have their emotions aroused by fantastic musical sounds or visual rhythms or acrobatic feats, or by words that tell them what to think. Mime is an art that, paradoxically, appeals both to those who respond instinctively to entertainment and to those whose appreciation is more analytical and complex.

Between these extremes lie those audiences conditioned to resist any collaboration with what is played before them, and these the mime must charm despite themselves. There is only one way to attack those reluctant minds—take them unaware! They will be delighted at an unexpected pleasure.
