Ever since the first time I visited, I've been in love with the Sahara. That was in Morocco in 2011, to survey the situation of the Saharan cheetah (猎豹). I am a conservation biologist, and I quickly realized the importance of preserving these forgotten animals. It's especially key in the context of climate change, to see how they adapt to drought, for instance.

The scientific community has paid little attention to Saharan wildlife. Almost nobody knows about the sand cat, for example. This beautiful animal emphasizes the challenges that all ecological research faces in <u>hostile</u> and remote environments, such as the Sahara. My colleagues and I have published the only scientific estimate of the sand cat's population.

It is difficult to work in such an isolated area. We must take a lot of care to avoid landmines left from regional conflict, for example, by using maps and avoiding the areas that local camel keepers also avoid.

I'm the chairman of the non-governmental organization Wildlife Research and Conservation, Ciudad Real, Spain. My fieldwork group is made up of a translator, scientists and wildlife experts. Some of the members also have skills as mechanics. We usually travel in two cars, with eight to ten people in total. Our expeditions (考察) last for 10—20 days. We need to carry enough water,

food and fuel to see us through. We try to avoid the summer, because it's impossible to carry as much water as we would need. We leave camera traps for up to a year. But we have to check them about every four months to replace the batteries and any pieces of equipment destroyed by the environment or people.

The Sahara is one of the most endangered ecosystems in the world. It's an urgent conservation priority to document this.

By now, we all know that the planet is facing more environmental disasters, with quick-to-disintegrate (快速瓦解的) fast fashion clothing and the industry that creates it a major reason. Need proof? Just look at the 60,000-tonnemountain of poisonous and thrown-away clothing that is visible from space.

Now, France is taking steps to resist the supercharged way we consume clothes, with the country recently announcing it will pay all citizens a "repair bonus" for taking their clothes in to get fixed rather than throwing them in the bins.

Beginning in October, citizens who bring their clothes in for repair will be able to claim back a  $\in 6$  to  $\in 25$  bonus, with the total payment depending on the complexity of the repair. All bonuses will be paid from a  $\in 154$  million sustainability fund the government has set aside for the next five years.

By calling on people to take their items to get fixed, the government hopes to cut fast fashion waste throughout the country and encourage customers to purchase more "virtuous" products. In other words, the government is begging you to fix your clothes, rather than continuously over-consuming the products of fast fashion sites like Shein or Boohoo.

"It could encourage exactly the people who have bought, for example, shoes from a brand that makes good-quality shoes or likewise good-quality ready-to-wear clothes to want to have them fixed instead of getting rid of them," explained France's junior ecology minister Bérangère Couillard, who announced the

programme in Paris. "That is exactly the objective, to create a recycling economy for shoes and clothes so that products last longer, because in government we believe in the second life of a product."

She also shared hopes that the programme will increase employment for French tailors and shoemakers. "The goal is to support those who carry out the repair," she explained, while inviting all repair shops to join in the campaign for free.

Global scientists warned that 45% of known flowering plant species are at risk of disappearing, highlighting the urgent need for international action to address the planet's sixth mass extinction, driven by human activity. This finding is part of the fifth annual report, "State of the World's Plants and Fungi (菌类)", from the UK's Royal Botanic Gardens (RBG), Kew, which explores the biodiversity crisis and climate emergency.

The report emphasizes that the resources and services nature provides, such as food and fresh water, are the result of long-term ecosystem development. Rapid decline of ecosystems, greenhouse gas emissions, and water pollution risk are affecting the global balance established through evolutionary (进化的) processes. Effective management of plants and fungi is crucial to preventing biodiversity loss and restoring ecosystems.

"Every species we lose is a potential source of new medicines or solutions to hunger," the report notes. The report relies on two major advances: the completion of the first geographically complete World Checklist of Vascular (维管的) Plants and new data on fungal diversity from environmental DNA analyses.

The checklist includes 350,386 known vascular plant species, but as many as 100,000 more remain unidentified. Experts estimate that three out of four undescribed vascular plants are likely already at risk. Kew scientists suggest treating all newly described species as threatened unless proven otherwise.

The fungi section of the report highlights that only 155,000 species have been formally named, with estimates of total diversity ranging

from 250,000 to 19 million. Scientists now estimate there are 2.5 million fungal species, meaning over 90% remain unnamed. However, efforts to identify species continue, and over 8,600 plant species and 10,200 fungal species have been named since 2020.

The Kew report follows other alarming studies this year, including findings that 34% of plant species and 40% of animal species in the United States are at risk of extinction. It also comes after the Kunming-Montreal Global Biodiversity Framework, a pact (公约) aimed at safeguarding nature, though some advocates argue it is not strong enough.

The energy crisis hasn't been a crisis for big fossil fuel companies. Companies like BP and Shell have posted greater profits in recent years with gas prices rising greatly. However, a number of families have fallen into fuel poverty in the UK, according to the charity National Energy Action.

Against this background, a quiet revolution has been taking place in the UK, where some communities are taking back energy independence. Encouraged by the falling cost of renewables, some communities across the country are beginning to meet their own energy needs, making them less <u>vulnerable</u> to price jumps, while reducing their carbon emissions at the same time.

One innovative community energy cooperative called South East London Community Energy (Selce) has taken on the double task of expanding the amount of local solar power and handling the growing issue of families being forced to choose between heating and eating. Over the last 10 years, Selce has raised more than £500,000 to provide free solar power for a dozen local community buildings—mostly primary schools. Each year, its team of trained energy advisors helps around

2,000 vulnerable families from falling into fuel debt. The Greenwich-based cooperative has also set up a range of free advice workshops and programmes supported by government to help local homes with heat pumps (管道) and solar power. Meanwhile, the government has promised to provide greater support for the community energy department with low-interest loans. So, does this mean a sunny future for groups like Selce?

"It's definitely good news but we're waiting to see the details," says Camilla Berens,one communal director. "Certainly,we can't stop everything. We live in an area where the support infrastructure (基础建设) is under incredible pressure." However,she remains optimistic. "Whatever happens,we'll carry on," she says. "I really believe that community energy groups like Selce are playing a key role in building the path to a sustainable future."

In recent years, there has been a noticeable change in the attitude towards animal welfare here in the Philippines, a movement that I hope will lead to a lasting, systemic change.

Among the many inspiring and pioneering animal welfare advocates doing the good work here in the country is Rina Ortiz, the founder of Biyaya Animal Care, who has a strong understanding of the popular landscape here in the country.

While other animal welfare programmes are dependent only on donor funding or government support, Biyaya Animal Care serves as a model on sustainable animal welfare advocacy—operating a pet clinic and using earnings to support over a thousand pets housed in an animal shelter in Alfonso, Cavite.

This, of course, is made possible because Ortiz understands the challenges caused by limited resources—both from the government and the private sector—in supporting animal welfare, prompting her to find sustainable solutions to support this important cause.

The Biyaya Animal Care model proves the

importance of adaptability and resourcefulness. Through a self-sustaining mechanism, Biyaya Animal Care shows that animal welfare doesn't have to be a zero-sum game but rather a cooperation where the private sector can play a more active role in pushing for the cause.

I share Ortiz's passion for sustainable animal welfare advocacy, which is why I introduced the cause to my own workplace, Meralco, and went a step further by institutionalizing it.

Through Meralco, employees are able to contribute to efforts to address the overpopulation problem of homeless cats with neutering (绝育) programmes. By doing so, it also contributes to improving public health conditions since controlling the growth of the homeless animal population through neutering helps minimize the risk of rabies (狂犬病). Thus that would not only benefit animals but also contribute to the improvement of community life, public health and safety.

Across the world, humans purchase around 1.3 billion single-use plastic water bottles a day. Because only about 9% of plastic is recycled, the vast majority of those bottles wind up in landfills, the ocean, or elsewhere in nature.

When beach-loving Madison noticed those plastic bottles littering the shoreline during her family's trips to California, the 12-year-old told *Smithsonian Magazine*, "I just felt like this needed to change."

So as she began thinking about what to do for her school science fair, back in 2021, the idea of a project centred on reducing plastic pollution quickly came to her mind: she would design an eatable water bottle called the Eco-Hero.

"One of my biggest ambitions for my project was wanting to help the world," the confident young inventor said in a video on a website.

To bring her idea to life, Madison built upon already established methods by experimenting with common food materials. She also took inspiration from previous versions of eatable water bottles, though she focused on making hers bigger and more durable. She found that the combination of water, lemon juice, natural gum, and alginic acid (褐藻酸) resulted in a gel pouch that wouldn't break, could hold up to 3/4 cup of water, and would last in the fridge for three weeks.

Though she'd like to improve the Eco-Hero by making it able to hold more water, she believes her current version would work well as a replacement for the paper cups used by runners in races. All one needs to do is bite a hole in the water ball, drink the water, and then eat the pouch or throw it away to biodegrade.

Madison hopes the Eco-Hero inspires others to take better care of the planet. "It doesn't necessarily have to be in a big way," she told *Smithsonian Magazine*. "People can still make a difference in the world, even if it's just in a small way."

Smartphones enable our desire for ease and convenience. But sometimes—whether it's running a marathon, climbing a mountain, or assembling furniture—we willingly choose difficulty over ease. Michael Inzlicht, a psychologist at the

University of Toronto, calls this the effort paradox. While we often avoid hard work, other times we value it, viewing things as more rewarding if we have to work for them.

This phenomenon extends beyond extreme pursuits like mountain climbing or marathon running. Many individuals seek out challenging activities such as puzzles or crosswords because the effort itself is enjoyable. This appreciation of effort is deep-rooted in our brains, as dopamine (多巴胺) encourages us to value tasks that demand perseverance and dedication. "Sometimes effort is the only way that you can test yourself," says Inzlicht.

In a study by a psychiatrist at Stanford University School of Medicine, mice learned to poke (伸) their noses into a hole to obtain juice. When the number of pokes it took to receive juice was raised, or mild electric shocks were given, more dopamine was released in the striatum, a brain region important for motivation and experiencing reward. It also found that people rewarded for choosing a more difficult task opted for the difficult version the next time, even if it no longer came with a reward. This appreciation of hard work transfers to unrelated tasks, from school and sports to work and parenting.

Still, putting down our phones and seeking <u>exertion</u> may be difficult at first. Anna Lembke, a psychiatrist at Stanford University School of Medicine, suggests building it into our schedule and doing it with friends or for a greater good, like running a race for charity or biking to save gas.

"Sometimes the same effort can become boring and frustrating, so keep it fresh: find a new park to walk through or save a favourite show or podcast for the gym. We can strive for a healthier balance between seeking pleasure and embracing challenges," Lembke says. "We are born to strive, but it's up to us to channel that drive in a sustainable and fulfilling way."

# ● 阅读理解(每小题 2.5 分,满分 10 分)

Many of us would probably say that lying is a matter of moral choice. But in his philosophy book *A History of Lying*, Juan Jacinto Muñoz-Rengel takes us in a different direction, which he calls "non-moral".

He takes several persuasive steps to redirect us. First, he asks us to take into account how we represent reality to ourselves, and how we see it in relation to the self. This requires us to employ awareness of not just the world but also the concepts to describe it to ourselves and others. Moreover, the "reality" we believe we see and know might be an illusion (错觉). So how do we even know when we're telling the truth, and when we're lying about it?

His second step is to say that our sense of personal identity should be treated with doubt, since we're frequently wrong about our own experiences. If continuing personal identity might be an illusion, then the reality we see might be an illusion as well. But we choose to take part like actors in this illusion.

From here Muñoz-Rengel takes a third step towards what he calls "evolutionary epistemology (认识论)", which shows everything we claim to know should be evaluated through an evolutionary angle. For instance, to stay safe from natural enemies or hunt for food, some animals evolve into being capable of mixing with the surroundings to <u>delude</u> others. The thing is, the species continues through natural selection processes. Equally, we grow myths to explain the natural world and our place in it...As individuals and as societies, various forms of lies are built into our DNA.

The arguments in this book are strongly made, but more than a few of Muñoz-Rengel's

viewpoints need far more evidence as support. But anyhow, in separating the discussion from conventional morality-based studies of lying, he has produced a lively and distinctive work. But still, there is one thing to remember—we perhaps will be liars, but that doesn't mean we shouldn't ask ourselves when it is acceptable to lie and when it isn't.
