In 1995, Uyinga left her home on the grassland to study at the Inner Mongolia University of Finance and Economics in the regional capital, Hohhot. After graduating with a bachelor's degree in land resource management, she immediately decided to return home as she believed the vast grassland had more opportunities to offer than big cities.

"I was born on the grassland, and I had a free spirit. And the infrastructure such as roads and telecommunication on the grassland has been significantly improved, so it can be just as convenient to start businesses at my home," Uyinga said.

Following the recommendation of a career adviser on e-commerce, she started to post videos about the life of herdsmen(牧民)on social media in January 2018. "There wasn't any influencer posting about the life of herdsmen in Inner Mongolia back then. And my first goal was to clear up people's misunderstandings about herdsmen," she said. Like many people from the region, Uyinga is often asked if locals ride horses to school and work. "Many people aren't familiar with life and culture on the grassland. In fact, the herdsmen's life on the grassland has also been improved and modernized. At the same time, we have kept our traditions alive," she said.

Besides enjoying the stunning sunrises and sunsets in the short videos posted by Uyinga, people are particularly interested in how her family prepares traditional Mongolian food, such as dairy products, milk tea and boiled meat. One of Uyinga's videos that went viral

features her family storing meat for a harsh winter ahead. It has received more than 9 million views on social media platforms. "I've never imagined people can be so interested in our normal routines. It has made me more determined to promote our rich culture and heritage," Uyinga said.

She now has more than 1.18 million followers on the short video platform Douyin, but she said she doesn't like to be called an influencer. "I am simply a recorder of the grassland and the lifestyle of the herdsmen," she said.

The lack of something we consider vital, such as time or food, can powerfully shape our thinking and behaviour. Take money for example. When people play a game that makes some players suddenly wealthier or poorer, those who lose money start making decisions that result in their being better off now but worse off later. One potential explanation for this tendency is that shortage of something is mentally challenging. Not having enough of what we need becomes a distraction that makes it harder for us to focus and plan.

In recent work, however, we found that people react to water shortage very differently than they do to other shortages. People in places in short of water think more about the long term. Worrying about water shortage led to better planning and less wasteful behaviour—not only with water but with other resources, too.

In one experiment, we brought 211 college students to the lab and asked some of them to read an article that predicted the worst "water shortage in 1,200 years". Others read a more upbeat article about how climate change means more rain and therefore enough water. The rest of the students completed the study without reading an article.

We then asked the students how important it was to save resources and think about the long term. Participants who read about a serious shortage agreed more with statements like "People should live for the future." and "There are things I resist buying today so I can

save for tomorrow." Participants reading the other article were pushed in the opposite direction. They were more likely to support living for the present and cared less about saving money and other resources when compared with those who didn't read about climate change.

Our work suggests that as many places dry up, global warming could reshape how people think, pushing entire communities towards more cautious, future-oriented behaviour. That may offer a ray of hope amid the threat of climate change. Water shortage could be uniquely powerful motivation for us to prepare for and respond to a warmer world.

Smartphones enable our desire for ease and convenience. But sometimes—whether it's running a marathon, climbing a mountain, or assembling furniture—we willingly choose difficulty over ease. Michael Inzlicht, a psychologist at the University of Toronto, calls this the effort paradox. While we often avoid hard work, other times we value it, viewing things as more rewarding if we have to work for them.

This phenomenon extends beyond extreme pursuits like mountain climbing or marathon running. Many individuals seek out challenging activities such as puzzles or crosswords because the effort itself is enjoyable. This appreciation of effort is deep-rooted in our brains, as dopamine (多巴胺) encourages us to value tasks that demand perseverance and dedication. "Sometimes effort is the only way that you can test yourself," says Inzlicht.

In a study by a psychiatrist at Stanford University School of Medicine, mice learned to

poke (伸) their noses into a hole to obtain juice. When the number of pokes it took to receive juice was raised, or mild electric shocks were given, more dopamine was released in the striatum, a brain region important for motivation and experiencing reward. It also found that people rewarded for choosing a more difficult task opted for the difficult version the next time, even if it no longer came with a reward. This appreciation of hard work transfers to unrelated tasks, from school and sports to work and parenting.

Still, putting down our phones and seeking <u>exertion</u> may be difficult at first. Anna Lembke, a psychiatrist at Stanford University School of Medicine, suggests building it into our schedule and doing it with friends or for a greater good, like running a race for charity or biking to save gas.

"Sometimes the same effort can become boring and frustrating, so keep it fresh: find a new park to walk through or save a favourite show or podcast for the gym. We can strive for a healthier balance between seeking pleasure and embracing challenges," Lembke says. "We are born to strive, but it's up to us to channel that drive in a sustainable and fulfilling way."
